The Workshop: This workshop will cover the latest developments in the assessment of behavioral, social, and clinical aspects of children's functioning. It will be based on Dr. Sattler's latest book, *Foundations of Behavioral, Social, and Clinical Assessment of Children (Sixth Edition)*. Topics will include bullying, cyberbullying, sports-related injuries, executive functions, LD, ADHD, and autism spectrum disorders. Attention will be given to DSM-5 and IDEA 2004. The Resource Guide contains numerous checklists, forms, and semi-structured interviews related to the assessment of children with special needs and to children who are at risk. Currently, he is Professor Emeritus and an Adjunct Professor of Psychology at San Diego State University. In 1998 he received the Senior Scientist Award from the Division of School Psychology of the American Psychological Association. In 2003, he received an honorary Doctor of Sciences degree from Central Missouri State University. In 2005, he received the Gold Medal Award for Life Achievement in the Application of Psychology from the American Psychological Foundation. In 2006, he received the Distinguished Contribution to Psychology Award from the San Diego Psychological Association.

His books include Assessment of Children, Cognitive Applications (Fifth Edition), Assessment of Children, Behavioral, Social, and Clinical Foundation (Fifth Edition; with Robert Hoge), Assessment of Children: WISC-IV and WPPSI-III Supplement (with Ron Dumont), Assessment with the WAIS-IV (with Joseph J. Ryan), and Clinical and Forensic Interviewing of Children and Families. He has published over 100 articles in the fields of school and clinical psychology and is a co-author of the Stanford-Binet Intelligence Scale: Fourth Edition. The first five editions of Assessment of Children have been translated into Spanish. In 2007, a Spanish translation and a Chinese translation of Assessment of Children, Behavioral, Social, and Clinical Foundation (Fifth Edition) were published.

Dr. Sattler's books have served as texts for assessment courses for many psychologists and school psychologists since 1974. It is difficult to write a book or journal article on assessment without citing Sattler.
